Dave Endres reported that Mr. Sebranek wasn't able to attend any meetings. Dave will follow up on Mr. Schultz's letter, as he is the liaison.

The Jazz Clinic at Riverview was cancelled due to lack of schools being interested.

On February 3, a group from UW Madison will perform at PHS. The group is called "REDEFINED". They are an a Capella group and will feature our own Andy Talen. Dinner will be served beforehand for the performers. We have all volunteered to bring food for the dinner. Tickets will go on sale January 2, 2007. The seating is reserved and will cost \$7 for adults and \$5 for students. Also performing will be the PHS Swing Choir.

Dave Endres will change the format of the website so that the edge of printing will not be cut off.

Discussion was held on an alternative to medals for Solo Ensemble. The cost is running very high, about the same as we make at German Night. No decision was made; a survey will be done with outgoing seniors to determine the medals importance to students.

Barb Rudden-Hunter has volunteered to work on locker signs. Some samples were provided. We thought is a good idea. Help will be needed to put them all up. It will be re-addressed at the next meeting.

New Business

Cathy Kelling reported on the state of the flag carriers uniforms. She showed us some boots with nails sticking out of the heel, heels coming off, and a cracked hat. The topic will be addressed with Mr. Sebranek. We could possibly help financially or with the monitoring the condition of uniforms. Cathy checked on some websites and found the approximate cost to be \$225 to replace a complete uniform.
