Gear for Weekend Campouts

- Water Bottle** (*see through Nalgene type*)
- Rain Jacket and Rain Pants**
- Hiking Boots** (*MUST be Waterproof*)
- Sleeping Bag with Waterproof Stuff Sack**
- Sleeping Bag Pad**
- Plate or Bowl and Drinking Cup**
- Knife, Fork, Spoon**
- Flashlight** (*small AA-battery type*)
- Extra Set of AA-Flashlight Batteries**
- Toothbrush and Small Toothpaste**
- Toilet Paper** (*in Ziploc bag*)
- Class-A Uniform** (*shirt, belt, pants, socks*)
- 2 Extra Class-B T-shirts** ** (*Troop shirts*)
- Extra Scout Pants**
- 2 Extra Pairs of Scout Socks**
- Underwear**
- Light Jacket** **
- Hat** ** (*ball cap type or wide brim type*)
- Lip Balm**
- Sunscreen and Bug Spray** (*seasonal*)
- Compass** (*check with Scoutmaster before buying*)
- Pocket Knife** (*must have Totin' Chip card to carry knife*)
- Fire Starter** (*must have Firem'n Chit card*)
- Personal First Aid Kit** (*see kit contents at right*)
- Scout Handbook**
- 2 Trash Bags**
- Folding chair** (*optional*)
- Backpack**
- Backpack Rain Cover**

(Do NOT buy a **backpack** until discussing subject with the Scoutmaster)

Include for COLD Weather Camping

- fleece sleeping bag liner (*for added warmth*)
- 2 fleece jackets (*not cotton*)
- long sleeve T-shirts (*optional*) (*not cotton*)
- long Scout pants (*not jeans or cotton*)
- long underwear (*not cotton*)
- heavy hiking socks for warmth
- cap for sleeping (*keeps head warm at night*)
- gloves

> **Pack all clothes in Ziploc bags to keep dry.**

** Themes, logos, graphics must be "Scout appropriate". If not sure, do not use it or check with the Scoutmaster.

Tents, food and cooking gear supplied by the troop. Absolutely NO FOOD in personal gear!

Outdoor Essentials for Day Hiking

- Lightweight Day Pack**
- Rain Gear** (*jacket and pants*)
- Extra Pair of Socks and Sock Liners** (*in Ziploc*)
- Flashlight** (*small AA-battery type*)
- Personal First Aid Kit** (*see kit contents below*)
- Toilet Paper** (*in Ziploc bag*) and **Trowel**
- Hat** ** (*ball cap type or wide brim type*)
- Light Jacket** ** (*seasonal*)
- Lip Balm** (*seasonal*)
- Sunscreen and Bug Spray** (*seasonal*)
- Compass** (*check with Scoutmaster before buying*)
- Pocket Knife** (*must have Totin' Chip card to carry knife*)
- Fire Starter** (*must have Firem'n Chit card*)

Personal First Aid Kit

(place all items in small Ziploc bag)

- 6 - adhesive bandages
- 2 - 3"x3" sterile gauze pads
- 1 - small roll of adhesive tape
- 3 - alcohol pads
- 1 - small bar soap
- 1 - sheet of mole skin for blisters
- 1 - pair latex gloves
- pencil and paper

Backpacking Gear Checklist

When backpacking, you will carry your personal items, and your share of patrol gear and food. Be sure to leave room in your pack for food and patrol gear.

- Backpack**
- Backpack Rain Cover**
- 1-liter Nalgene type Water Bottle**
- additional **Water Bottles** for a total of **3-liter** capacity
- Rain Jacket and Rain Pants**
- Hiking Boots** (*MUST be Waterproof*)
- Sleeping Bag with Waterproof Stuff Sack**
- Sleeping Bag Pad**
- Bowl and Spoon** (*plastic or lightweight metal*)
- Flashlight** (*small AA-battery type*)
- Toothbrush and Small Toothpaste**
- Toilet Paper** (*in Ziploc bag*)
- Class-A Uniform** (*shirt, belt, pants, socks*)
- extra Class-B **T-shirt** (*Troop shirt*)
- extra pair **Scout Pants**
- 2 extra pair heavy **Hiking Socks**
- 2 extra pair **Sock Liners**
- Fleece Jacket** (*not cotton*)
- Hat** (*ball cap type*)
- Lip Balm**
- Personal First Aid Kit**
- Compass** (*check with Scoutmaster before buying*)
- Pocket Knife** (*must have Totin' Chip card to carry knife*)
- Fire Starter** (*must have Firem'n Chit card*)
- 2 Trash Bags**

When Its **COLD** -- you'll need the following too

- fleece sleeping bag liner (*for added warmth*)
- second fleece jacket (*not cotton*)
- long sleeve T-shirt (*not cotton*)
- long underwear (*not cotton*)
- cap for sleeping (*keeps head warm at night*)
- gloves
