

Camp Campbell Site survey October 1st 2008

The first thing we noticed was the road into camp was graded and had gravel laid down on it.

They currently have gravel going all the way to the waterfront and most of the other roads graded and ready for gravel.

It appears like all the roads will have a gravel surface soon.

The dump trucks and graders were in there today working while we were there.

Water has been run to all the campsites, including the activity field and the waterfront.

It runs off the well in the blockhouse and a 200 gallon tank has been installed inside.

I asked if the water was potable and was told yes.

These were the visible improvements.

We talked with the Committee chair of Great Northern Harry Talley and he told us the following which looking at the pace of work I believe these things will happen.

A new shelter like the one in the activity field is to be built at the waterfront, the exact location is unknown, but if it is near the water spigot it will be up on the right of the road as you enter the waterfront area.

The water spigot was placed near the shelter in the activity field so this seems to be a reasonable assumption.

There is a new engineer from the core overseeing the property and she has given consent to cut any tree 3" and under, Plans are underway to clear out the overgrown campsites and make them useable again.

The core has also volunteered to do a controlled burn to clear out underbrush this winter.

The blockhouse is to be renovated.

The existing structure must stay the same on the outside.

The plans are to renovate the inside.

This consists of removing the garage doors and putting windows on the left and doors on the right the concession windows will remain but probably be improved.

There will be male and female restrooms and showers added and a kitchen area.
