

# Lattice Lace Wrap



**Size:** One size.

**Finished Measurements:** 20 inches by 73 inches.

**Materials:** 2 skeins Alpaca Cloud from Knitpicks (100% alpaca lace weight yarn, 440 yds./50 gm.); 4 packages 2 cut glass beads (20gm/0.705 oz) (approximately 4000 beads total); size 4 straight or circular needles.

**Carefully read all instructions before beginning.**

**Notes:**

1. Beads are applied to the work on the side facing away from you. In this pattern the beads are applied to the RIGHT SIDE of the wrap while you are knitting a WRONG SIDE row.
2. The wrap begins and ends with five garter stitch ridges (10 rows.) A bead is suspended between each stitch on the wrong side rows only.
3. The first and last five stitches on each long edge of the wrap are knit in garter stitch. A bead is suspended between each stitch on the wrong side rows only.
4. The lattice pattern is reverse stockinette based lace. The lace is created on the knit (WS) side. A plain purl row follows each pattern row. The beads are applied to the lace on the patterned (knit) rows.
5. The Lattice Lace pattern forms small diamonds between the lattices. To bead the stitches of these diamonds slip the stitches indicated in the chart with the yarn in back (wyb) and slide a bead up close the right hand needle before working the next stitch or yo.
6. The charts show only the wrong side (patterned) rows. A plain purl row should be knit after each patterned row.
7. Slide the unused beads down the length of the yarn leaving enough yarn to knit several rows. Each row requires approximately two arm lengths of yarn. Leave approximately 1.5 hand widths of beads to work in these rows.
8. Avoid "pushing" the beads down the length of the yarn as this abrades the yarn. Instead, gently hold one hand-width of beads and slowly draw the yarn through the beads, keeping the beads supported in your hand.
9. Charts are worked from right to left.
