A Message From The President

THANK YOU!

As we begin a new congregational year, please take time to thank those people who have served on committees during the past year. No religious association could survive for even a few days without the efforts of many, many workers. I especially want to thank Shawn Hedman and Robert Phillips who are leaving our Board after serving three-year terms.

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that Unitarian Universalist membership has remained stagnant at around 145,000 for over 45 years while the U.S. population has soared about 90%? If our numbers had merely maintained pace with the general population gains, we would now top 275,000 UU's, and our message – our **good news** – would be far more powerful.

Perhaps our good news is not good enough. Do we even offer a message, a truly compelling vision, of a way of life worth living? The same can be asked of UUCL. What do we really offer?

Here at General Assembly, nearly 6,000 UU's are thinking and talking about a new vision which will keep us from becoming ever more marginalized. We believe that we can provide a view of decent living, but we don't seem able to get the word out.

Our challenge as a congregation and as a denomination is to develop such a compelling vision in thirty words or less. Can we do it? My challenge to each of you is to reflect on this task and to begin this revisioning process. Our Board has been asked to take a stab at it for its July meeting.

Yesterday our UUA president, William Sinkford, asked, "What do we do on Sunday morning to let in the holy?" (To let in God which is good with one less 'o'.) Our diversity of approaches, our pluralism, is a way to be together, but it is not an end in itself. He continued by saying that we need to honor this diversity yet not STOP with it. What wonderful food for thought General Assembly provides.

HERE'S ANOTHER IDEA

Many of our churches donate to a charity all the coins collected each Sunday morning. People who normally do not proffer coins will do so when they realize that this is a part of their congregation's way of being in the world. Robert Fulghum today related his experience with the Starr King president when Fulghum asked for some financial aid shortly before graduation. He was turned down flat because his submitted budget did not contain any provision for charitable giving! He was told that his budget did not reflect the values Starr King wished to instill. Needless to say, Fulghum rewrote the budget! What do you think?

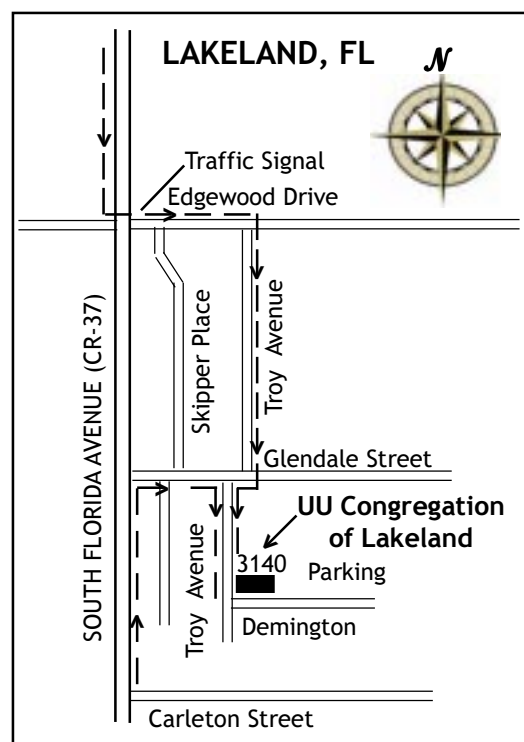
